I also know the importance of time for all of us. From time to meet with over 200 students in a remote environment to time needed for Kindergarten screenings to time to develop our Extended Learning Plans for summer, our district is utilizing time on Fridays to avoid the need to pull teachers from classrooms Monday through Thursday (thus maximizing instructional time). While I know this decision may be frustrating, because we all want to get back to our normal, I do believe this is the best course of action for our district at this time.
